Following its first meeting in September 2021, the regional programme's steering committee held its annual meeting on Wednesday 26 October 2022 to review progress and plan for 2023.

With all six landscape programmes up and running, the 40 meeting participants looked at progress made and reviewed achievements against indicators of the PAPFor funding agreement.

PAPFor and WABILED launch a study on sustainable cocoa!

Since november, Kinomé, which has extensive experience on the topic, is **collecting experiences** from the different PAPFor landscapes, **compiling** a body of literature already available and **conducting**



interviews in preparation for a regional workshop to be organised in early 2023.

This initiative will enable implementing agencies to be better equipped to implement their cocoa-related activities and contribute not only to stopping deforestation but also to maintaining biodiversity in the areas concerned.

A first draft of the study's report will be available by the end of February 2023. Look out for the next newsletter to find out.

Community training in agroecological techniques

From 8 to 13 November 2022, WCF organised a training on agroecological practices for 133 members of agricultural cooperatives from 14 villages. The training was part of the community development activities within the future Pinselli-Soyah-Sabouyah national park

Three modules: sustainable natural resource management, agroecologicals practices, conservation and valorisation of agricultural products.

EU ROM conducted for PAPFor Gola Landscape (Liberia and Sierra Leone)

The two-week long trip involved meetings, interview with key stakeholders, government institutions, consultants and community members. A key part of the task included field visits to protected areas and community forests in Sierra Leone and Liberia.

The ROM provided an opportunity to interact with project beneficiaries, and to share ideas and knowledge on efficiency, effectiveness in carrying out project activities and the crucial need for focus on sustainability.

Transboundary coordination restarts in WWZ landscape

A meeting to reactivate transboundary coordination in the Wologizi-Wonegizi-Ziama (WWZ) landscape was held with representatives from Liberia and Guinea on 12 October in Zorzor, Liberia.

The meeting resulted in updating the draft terms of reference of the transboundary steering committee, and in the development of a detailed plan for the first joint transboundary border patrols.

Improving cocoa sustainability to reduce deforestation and improved livelihoods

Over the last few months, the PAPFor project in Cross River has established 16 new nurseries in the communities surrounding Cross River National Park and plans to raise 160 000 improved cocoa seedlings. Each farmer signs a 'conservation contract' and agrees to limit cocoa expansion

BIODIVERSITY FOCUS



The white-necked rockfowl

This exceptional bird, together with its Central African cousin, are the only two members of the Picathartidae family in the world. It is found only in certain dense forests from Guinea to Ghana. It has a very distinctive appearance, which gives the impression that it comes from the time of the dinosaurs.

Despite its bright colours, it is rarely to be seen, as it silently scours the forest floor for insects, small amphibians or any other small animal within its reach.

ZOOM ON A PROTECTED AREA

Tiwai Island Sanctuary (Sierra Leone/Gola-Foya)

Tiwai Island is located in southern Sierra Leone and is part of the Gola-Foya Landscape. With Wildlife Sanctuary status since 1987, it is one of the best conserved protected areas in West Africa. Tiwai's primary attraction is the high concentration and diversity of primates, many of which are globally endangered. Tiwai Island is also known for its population of pygmy hippos and its 200 birds species.

As part of the Gola-Foya landscape, Tiwai Island receives support from PAPFor for the renovation of tourism infrastructure, for the development of the management plan and for maintaining a database on the island's biodiversity and past research results.
